5.6 Details of student counselling and career guidance

- All the 46 Class tutors interact with students individually at Personal Level. When they come across students with academic, personal and psycho-social issues they take steps to support the students.
- There is a Counselling Cell functioning at the College, comprising of a Convener and 4 members. Students with personal and psycho-social issues are provided support and succour and guidance to come out of the difficulties. Whenever the Cell finds things beyond its limitations, the services of an expert Counsellor is sought.
- Placement Cell of the College provided 2 Career Guidance programmes. The Cell organised programmes that guide them and help them in making progress as far as higher education and employment are concerned.
- The Discipline Committee also followed a counselling approach rather than a punitive one.
- Parents are also involved in counselling the students; whenever situation warrants, parents are called; PTA's views are also taken into account.

The Meeting starts with a prayer song which is followed by the Welcome Address, Report of the Previous Meeting, Felicitations and Presidential Address. Special Address is delivered by the Principal which covers the happenings of the College, since the previous Meeting, in connection with Curricular, Co-curricular and Extra-curricular activities. Then comes the interactive session, conducted by the Correspondent, during which time parents speak their mind out and the Correspondent, Principal or concerned staff responds to the queries of the parents. The meeting ends with a vote of thanks. After the Meeting, the parents visit the Departments where they have an interaction with the Tutors and Heads. At the Departments, the parents are apprised of their wards' academic growth.

Evidence of Success:

As mentioned earlier, as the Meetings are conducted on Sundays, parents attend in large numbers. The Parents eagerly take part in the Interactive sessions at the College level and at the Department level. Over the years, large numbers of issues expressed by them during Interactive sessions have been getting fulfilled.

On 08-10-2017, 1300 parents attended. On that day during interactive session the following suggestions were made.
